Like they're finally ready to begin their official "homeschooling." As I've shared before, we adhere to more of an unschooling approach with our preschool and elementary-aged kids, but we encourage them to learn how to properly write their name as soon as they are able to do so using editable name tracing worksheets. I also enjoy using a name tracing generator for each of my children so they have custom name practice sheets with their own names. Name Tracing Generator I had one child that did learn how to write their name before they mastered much of anything else. I'd tell my kids "trace your name", but they took it ever farther because they liked tracing names of everyone in our house, so I created some printable worksheets that could be used.
